Admission Requirements for the Master's Programs in Law:

- 1. The student must hold a Bachelor's degree in law or its equivalent from a university recognized by the Ministry of Education - Higher Education and Scientific Research Affairs in the United Arab Emirates.
- 2. The student's cumulative GPA must not be less than 2.5 out of 4or its equivalent.
- 3. A student with a GPA less than 2.5 but equal to or greater than 2 is allowed to join the Master's program after successfully passing the three preparatory courses with a GPA of 3 in each preparatory course. The preparatory courses are determined by the College Council at the beginning of each semester.»
- 4. 4.The student must obtain an English proficiency certificate (450in TOEFL, 4.5 in IELTS, 950 in EmSAT, or equivalent).

Master's Program in Criminal Sciences:

The Master's Program in Criminal Sciences focuses on providing in-depth studies in subjects related to criminal sciences and the associated subjects of criminal justice at the national, regional, and international levels.
